### Special features and options

When building a "wall nativity", an attempt is made to build a compressed and convincing nativity representation onto a picture frame with background image. These wall nativities are particularly suitable for small nativity scenes that require little depth. Just like the "picture nativity", the "wall nativity" is hung on the wall at approximately eye level and thus saves space. Various scenes such as: Rest during flight, Joseph's dream, figure groups at the fountain, Annunciation to Mary, Mary's visit with cousin Elizabeth, etc.! are very suitable for this type of nativity! In addition to the sparsely built nativity scene, a convincing background image should mainly mask the missing depth and give depth to the slightly reduced representation. The nativity scene and background should appeal to the viewer through harmonious lighting. Since these wall nativities are kept rather small, it is particularly important that the nativity meter is observed exactly. For building wall nativities we use mainly Styrodur and cork bark. The back wall should only be plugged or screwed so that the plate can be taken out for painting. Much joy and good success!
