### Special features and options

The "Dressing Nativity Figures" course is for beginners and advanced participants! We dress nativity figures consisting of carved wooden elements (head, feet, hands) connected with wire. This allows you to determine the posture and movement yourself. Work will be done with very thin fabrics made of cotton, linen and silk, some of which are dyed. Various gluing and fixing materials ensure that the drapery does not change anymore. The figures are then painted and by applying a patina they ultimately achieve a very natural look. MATERIAL LIST FOR DRESSING FIGURES: Apron, towel, kitchen roll, disposable gloves, cutting mat, scissors, nail clippers, Stanley knife, craft pliers, hair dryer, measuring tape or ruler, pins, wooden skewers (grill skewers), colorful threads and yarns, various brushes, small glue bottle, a flat plate, fabrics! exclusively natural fabrics, (very thin cotton,- linen,- silk), thin men's socks, T-shirt fabrics, men's shirts, headscarves, silk scarves, thin leather scraps, fabric handkerchiefs, particularly thin knitwear. All fabrics are best if they are old and very often washed!!! Color and pattern do not matter as we dye or paint over them!
