Special features and options

When building a "wall nativity scene", the aim is to create a compact and convincing nativity depiction in a picture frame with a background image. These wall nativity scenes are especially well suited to small nativity scenes that require little depth. Like the "picture nativity scene", the "wall nativity scene" is hung on the wall at about eye level and therefore saves a great deal of space. Various scenes are very suitable for this type of nativity scene, such as: rest on the flight, Joseph's dream, groups of figures at the well, the Annunciation to Mary, Mary's visit to her cousin Elizabeth, etc.! In addition to the sparingly built nativity scene, a convincing background image should above all conceal the lack of depth and give depth to the slightly reduced depiction. The nativity scene and background should appeal to the viewer through harmonious lighting. Since these wall nativity scenes tend to be small, it is particularly important that the nativity scale is observed precisely. For building wall nativity scenes we mainly use Styrodur and cork bark. The back wall should only be inserted or screwed in so that the panel can be removed for painting. Enjoy the work and good luck!
